4. Financial Statement/– DJS reported that another letter had been sent out to Holiday Home lets in the Village asking for a voluntary donation towards the precept. So far we have received £987.00 this is made up of payments from £25.00 to £150.00. Standing orders and Direct Debits have also been set up for following annual payments, this has been a very worthwhile exercise and thanks to everyone who has contributed.

5. Matters Arising –

- a. Gloroum Path – AB reported that he had not had the chance to visit the Caravan Parks but would try to do so and report back. We need to source funding. .
- b. The Wynding – Parking –KD reported that consultation was under way regarding double yellow lines on both sides of the Wynding using a seasonal option.

6. Streetscape/Speeding –

- Cllr Renner-Thompson reported that the 30mph speed sign was still at the farm,– this is still outstanding and he would chase up.
- Rumble Strips – This is ongoing, they will be removed once a new design has been agreed..
- GRT reported that the Community Speedwatch was currently being reviewed by the Police a further update would be provided.
- Lindisfarne Avenue – consultation has been completed, GRT to report back.
- Speed Van has been in the Village but was in the wrong location just outside the Lord Crewe .
- Street Lighting – Radcliffe Road – JM reported that information on the location of a new light has been sent to NCC, we are awaiting information on the cost of this before proceeding. Kate Morton may be aware of a funding stream we can apply to
- Northumberland Day, Judy Cowen reported that the WI were taking part and would be involved in handing over a large Northumberland flag as it travelled from Parish to Parish, Bamburgh WI would be dressing up as puffins to walk the flag along ‘Puffin Way’ between Seahouses and Bamburgh. It would be great if any of the pubs/shops/businesses would like to add to the celebration by decorating their premises, shop fronts. Bamburgh Parish Council would

be putting up bunting to decorate the Village. Bamburgh Parish Council also agreed to donate £100 towards supporting the WI.

- Spring Clean – WI are going to clean the benches around the village to support this initiative. The wooden bench outside of Blacketts is in need of restoration or a new one could be purchased. DS to ask Paul Brittain to have a look at it in the first instance and report back.
